Highlights at Girls Grammar - from the Principal

Whilst a year of challenge and change, 2020 was also a year of many achievements, adding another proud chapter in our 129-year history of providing quality education to girls.

Our Year 12s, as members of the first cohort to go through the new Queensland Certificate of Education, achieved the following outcomes:

- 96% of students attained their QCE compared with 89% of Year 12 students across the state.
- 93.3% of Girls Grammar students attained an ATAR, significantly higher than the state's 52.45%.
- Our School Dux attained an ATAR of 99.45 and a Certificate of Academic Commendation from the QCAA.
- Close to a quarter of our students attained ATARs over 90 (in the past, this would have been equivalent to OPs 1-6)
- 60% of results were an 'A' or 'B' grade and 95% of all grades were an 'A' to 'C'.

Our 2020 Seniors are now embarking on their post schooling pathways





of tertiary study, traineeships or work. Of those students who applied to QTAC for university entry, approximately 80% received their first preference and all girls who applied have been offered university placements.

Their studies span a range of areas including medicine and surgery, optometry, biomedical science, nursing, politics, podiatry, physiotherapy, astronomical and space sciences, business, education, public health, international studies and IT.

Girls Grammar's rich tradition of fostering academic strength and success across all year levels also continued in 2020 with teachers committed to the provision of enrichment and extension for those learners who thrive when the boundaries of academic rigour are extended.

Despite the cancellation of a number of traditional competitions, our girls were able to participate in ICAS competitions and the Maths Teams Challenge. Additionally, we had much success with our new primary enrichment program and the Optiminds Competition, where our students won both a Spirit Award and the Overall Championship for Central Queensland.

Student engagement in the cocurricular life of the school is also highly valued. Our students had access to over 15 different sports, across a range of competitions, many of which were modified due to the circumstances of 2020.

Our students represented Girls Grammar proudly with many successes. Our volleyball team won the Interschools Championship; we were awarded first place in the SLSQ Secondary School Surf League Percentage Trophy and our junior team won the Futsal Championships.

Our basketball team won all their games; however, with the season cut short due to COVID-19, they were denied the chance to play in a grand-final.

In the creative arts arena, our girls were provided opportunities to access ensembles, a musical, art camps and a range of other enrichment programs and clubs. Overcoming the many challenges, including having to rehearse online for several weeks, our musical, *Alice in Wonderland Jnr*, was a huge success. The outdoor teaparty setting, amazing props and outstanding performances showcased the many talents of the Girls Grammar girls, staff and parents.

For the last few months, the school has been a hive of activity as we have undertaken many capital works, including the refurbishment of secondary classrooms. Our new furniture is designed to facilitate the development of 21st century skills and to support students to collaborate, communicate in teams and problem-solve.

Our classrooms enhance student learning, including for students with needs, by catering for student choice. The implementation of new VIVI screen mirroring technology further supports learning through quality differentiation.

Other upgrades have included new furniture and flooring throughout Kollar House, our senior boarding facility; repainting and new furnishings in Jackson House, home to our junior boarders; renovation of a number of spaces in historic Paterson House; the relocation of our Uniform Shop to Paterson House; Stage 1 of our agricultural garden and a new alarm and security system across the school.

Early in 2021, our swimming pool will be refurbished; the Food and Textiles rooms and music spaces in the CAB will be renovated; the Old Girls Hall of Fame will be painted and created; all our roofs will be replaced and we will commence the tender process for our new covered multipurpose sports court.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our generous Old Girls for their engagement and service to the school. I am grateful for the volunteers who come in every Wednesday to record and archive the school's history, and to the many women who have volunteered to support our current students through the STEM Mentoring Program.

I am also appreciative of our five guest speakers who took the time in 2020 to inspire and motivate our current students. In Term 4 we welcomed Madelyn Holmes (2011) – Year 11 breakfast; Lacey Smith (2017 Valedictorian) – Primary Speech Night; Justine Barrett (Daniels, 2006 Helen E Downs Prefect) – Secondary Speech Night.

We have started planning our regional visits for 2021, and we are looking forward to meeting families and Old Girls across Central and Western Queensland. We will be travelling to Cunnamulla for the Isolated Children's Parents' Association State Conference in early June and plan to incorporate stops in Roma, Charleville, Alpha, Barcaldine and Emerald as part of our itinerary.

We also have planned visits to Biloela, Mackay, Gladstone, Calliope, Agnes Water, Gayndah and Bundaberg. We look forward to spending time with Old Girls, current, past and prospective parents and friends of the school as we travel throughout Queensland.

2020 required much energy, resilience, and determination. I am thankful for our staff, students, parents, past students and friends who united to turn the challenges into opportunities and to showcase Girls Grammar's 129 years of experience in supporting girls to be clever, confident and connected.

Memories of the 40s

Editor's Note: Following on from the article "Memories of the 1950s" in the October edition of Chit Chat, I have received a couple of requests for a follow up article on "Memories of the 1940s".

In my research, I have been able to source quite a few good quality photographs of our girls from that era. Unfortunately, I don't have any names. So if you recognize anybody, please let me know.

All the photos were sourced from Trove (National Archives) and are all dated in 1948. The four girls in the photograph below were the 1948 prefects.

The photographs show a mixture of uniforms with the blazer and skirt perhaps being the formal uniform and the pinafores for every day dress and sport. Also notice the black stockings.













Headmistresses of the School - Miss Smith

Editor's Note: This is the third in the series "Headmistresses of the School". For this edition, I have chosen Miss Margaret Smith, one of our long-term headmistresses, who was Headmistress 1925-1948. Miss Smith's arrival at the School was documented in the following newspaper article:

Source: Evening News May 1925

The new Headmistress of the Rockhampton Girls Grammar School, Miss M W Smith BA, arrived in Rockhampton this week. Miss Smith was for many years the Senior Mistress of the Brisbane Girls Grammar School. This post she resigned to go to Europe for further experience. While there, she made a study of modern educational methods and holds a Diploma of Education from Oxford University and a Teachers Diploma from the University of London. She also specialised In French and spent most of her third year abroad In Paris, qualifying for French certificates.

On her return at the beginning of last year, she was appointed to the staff of the Ipswich Girls Grammar School. Miss Smith comes to Rockhampton with a fine educational record behind her and being possessed of considerable teaching and organising ability, she will no doubt capably uphold the best tradition of the School.

Editor's Note: During Miss Smith's tenure, a new science laboratory was built and a second story was added to a portion of the building providing for a sick bay and staff rest rooms. Miss Smith was instrumental in obtaining several improvements in the lives of the boarders such as the School's first refrigerator and the first radio.

Miss Smith was also very civic minded and was a strong advocate for improvement of the City Baths as can be seen in the article below:

Source: Morning Bulletin Sep 1926

"Would you be good enough to let me know when the baths are to be opened this year," wrote Miss Marga-

ret Smith, Headmistress of the Girls Grammar School, to the City Council meeting yesterday, "and, if the system of putting them in charge of a lessee is being continued, who that lessee is? In a climate like this it is a thousand pities that the town baths are not more presentable, for, now that the Yaamba water supply is available, I feel that the school would use them regularly if they were painted and modernised. I sent my girls during the first term, but the baths are not attractive and quite unworthy of a town of this size. Surely, too, in a tropical climate it Is rather stupid to close them for six months of the year as swimming is one of the best of exercises for children, I do think that the Council should provide facilities to enable it to be taught properly under decent conditions".

Editor's Note: Miss Smith encouraged the girls to give to the community. Examples of this are recorded in the following two newspaper articles:

Source: Morning Bulletin Oct 1943

Mr J. Lawrence presided at the last meeting of the Rockhampton and District United War Fund Committee there also being present representatives from all affiliated bodies and the secretary treasurer (Mr J. W. Henderson). The Girls' Grammar School Headmistress (Miss M. Smith) forwarded £10 as a donation from the scholars, who had given up their individual prize list and sports day for this purpose. In moving that a letter of appreciation be sent to the donors, the chairman said it was a very commendable thing on the part of the school and something that would win widespread appreciation

Source: Morning Bulletin Oct 1948

"The girls would like to give the cheque the school choir won at the Eisteddfod last night to the United Nations' appeal for children. I therefore enclose it." This letter was received by the Mayor (Mr H. Jeffries) from Miss Margaret W. Smith, Headmistress of Girls' Grammar School



yesterday. "It is very heartening to receive this cheque as it is a very fine gesture of practical support for these unfortunate children", the Mayor commented, "It is an indication that the children have thoughts for others and is an example of that trite but true saying, that the greatest happiness comes from making other people happy."

.<u>Source: Morning Bulletin Dec</u> 1948

In her farewell to the students she urged them not to forget the most important lessons they had learnt in school - to be true, to be loyal, to be unselfish, to put the interests of the community before their own, to remember that great happiness lay in service to others and to show by their lives in the years to come that those who had taught them had not laboured in vain.

To the Trustees she said that she was an old grammar schoolgirl herself and most of her working life had been spent in grammar schools, so she knew something of their consid-

erable contribution to the higher education of the State. The independence of the governing trustees, the freedom of the headmistress in the choice of staff and the relatively small classes all made for flexibility and the half century and more of high traditions behind them, gave them dignity and standing.

The night also was the occasion of the retirement of the second mistress, Miss M. Hulbert, B.A., who had been a member of the staff for 25 years. A large attendance of parents, guardians, old girls and well-wishers crowded a spacious, floodlit netball court overlooking the city. At one end were two tables laden with book prizes, certificates, cups for scholastic achievements and sports trophies.

Editor's Note: Throughout her time at the School, Miss Smith received unstinting assistance from Miss Hulbert and constant support from the Chairman, Mr A H Paterson.


