Results received were pleasing and have provided feedback on the effectiveness of current strategies, areas for us to celebrate as well as prioritising aspects for improvement. Overall satisfaction scores from staff were 80%, students 75% and parents at 81%.

Responses to the open ended question, 'what do you like most about Rockhampton Girls Grammar School?' from parents included:

Community, connection and traditions. There is a connection of Old Girls through the Board, teachers, staff and current families who will continue with these values.

Community, small class sizes, regular school events, welcoming staff and parents.

I really like the long and proud history of the school and how the current leadership and staff ensure that this is not lost and a sense of pride is maintained. I like the 'boutique' nature and feel to the school and the close and nurturing support my daughter feels.

That they practise their values and that they are evident across every interaction I have had with RGGS staff from our very first day.

Comments such as these and more reinforce the passion for a school culture that is so strong and unique to Girls Grammar and what I am so proud to hear from our parent body.

Since the end of Term 2 we have seen some welcome additions to Girls Grammar. Our new Toyota Kluger Hybrid has been a welcome addition to the family, transporting myself and our enrolments officer to Ag Grow in Emerald and keeping busy throughout the week by transporting boarders to appointments and sporting commitments.

The removal of scaffolding and hoarding around Paterson House has revealed a shining red roof once again. The 18 month long roof restoration project has finally come to an end with only minor external building adjustments to come during the upcoming holiday period.

External painting, roofing, gutters and turrets along with shutters have brought our Heritage listed Paterson House back to life.

We can't wait to see the continued additions of the Old Girls Hall of Fame along the southern downstairs wing so we can continue to honour our schools heritage while embracing the future.

Make-good works have continued throughout Upper Paterson and refurbishment will be ongoing throughout the remainder of 2022 in order to provide office and meeting spaces for those staff members currently located in Upper Luck.

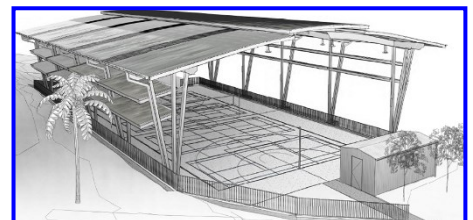
Installation of perspex ceilings have been an extremely effective feature in capturing the heritage of this 130 year old building. In the image below, you can view the northern wing turret including the original hot water tank.



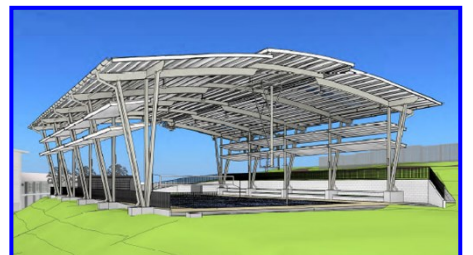
This will then make room for the next stage of the Master Planning process to commence with the Upper Luck refurbishment of old boarding dorm rooms to 4 general learning areas, with operable walls to transform in to 2 larger spaces with floor to ceiling windows to make the most of the view across Rockhampton City.

The much needed addition of two meeting rooms and residences at the Jackson end of the building to house two boarding supervisors will also be accommodated for.

By the start of Term 4, we will see the commencement of work on our new under cover court. Its location will be adjacent to the refurbished pool and changeroom and our boarding precinct, providing better visibility from Agnes Street, parking accessibility while making use of the natural tiered slope of the hill from Florence House.



This will be a welcome addition to our new 'sporting precinct' with construction commencing during the September holidays and completed by students' return in January 2023.



I look forward to seeing many of you throughout Term 4 and Old Girl end of year events. Enjoy the longer days and warmer weather.

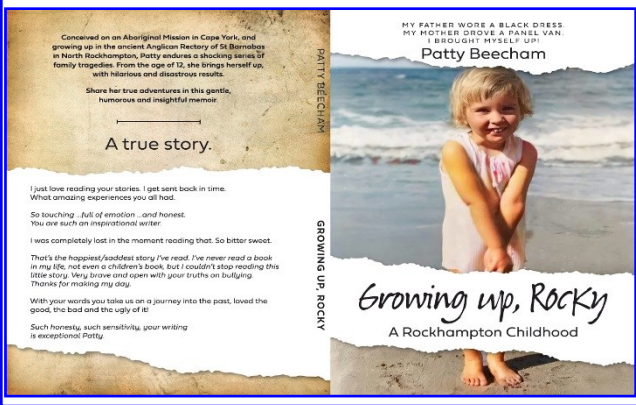

School memories - the circle room and more

Editor's Note: I received the following letter from Marian Shedden (Day) 1936-1947 who passed on some more school memories from the 40s era. I know many of our older Old Girls from that era remember the "circle room" and thought they might like to reminisce on Marian's story:

Dear Marilyn

After reading your article on Ida Kennedy, I decided to add a few more memories of her and my many years at the School.

I started in 1936 when we little ones were in an upstairs room in the big school but soon moved to the two houses on the hill.

They were really just two very big rooms. The second house was the "circle room" where we learnt to march and skip to Miss Rutherford's music staying within the two large concentric circle, painted on the floor.

The lavatory was down the hill behind the "circle room" and on very rainy days, we little ones were allowed to use a potty which Miss Rutherford kept in her store room.

Between the two houses was the wash room—a line of wash basins above which hung our individual towels with a little picture above each hook. Mine was a duck.

Ida would have started secondary school when I was about 8 years old; so when she became our form and elocution teacher in 1945, she would have been very young.

By then, grades 6 and 7 were back in the "circle room". It had been the art room somewhere in between and still had plaster casts of hands, feet etc on shelves around the walls.

One of the poems we had to learn from Miss Kennedy was a sad affair called "Lost" which we rendered with much sobbing and wringing of hands

which put poor Miss Kennedy into a state. We were fond of our teachers but that didn't stop us from testing their patience.

During the war years, we were allowed to wear sandals instead of shoes and socks to save our clothing coupons. This was great for passing notes to one another, tucked between our toes.

Another little habit was whistling between closed teeth which made it hard to spot the culprit.

My years at the little school were very happy ones but I did get into trouble a bit, like being sent to Miss Smith for some misdemeanour - very small I'm sure - which involved stepping over her rather smelly old dog "Terry" before standing before her

I usually ended up doing the latter as I could never quite memorise the poem.

I turned over a new leaf when I moved up to secondary school and was a model student.

I left at the end of 1947, so long ago, and now look back on those happy years. Thank you old school.

Both photos opposite were taken in 1937 and clearly show the two rooms that Marian referred to in her story.

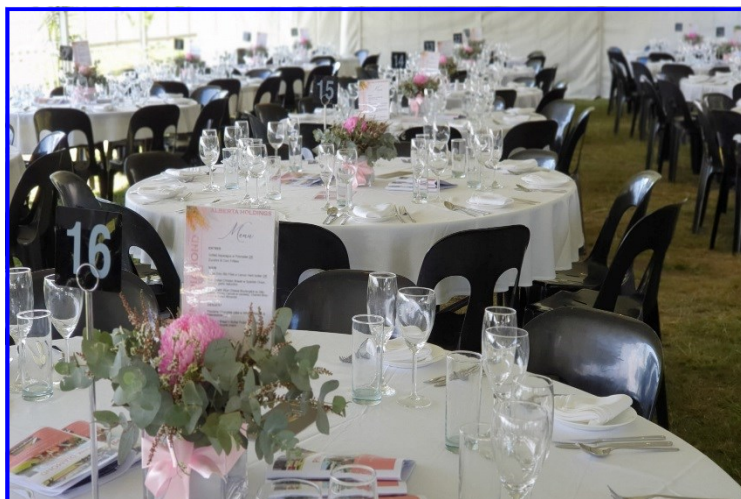


RGGS Race Day– June 2020

Vale - Jean Bulley

Jean Bulley nee Birchley (RGGGS 1946) was a much loved member of the Brisbane Branch of the RGGGS Old Girls' Association. She held the following executive positions on the Brisbane Branch OGA Committee: Vice-President 1996-1997 and President 1997-2000 and was a recipient of the prestigious OGA Special Service Badge for her loyal and ongoing service.

During her presidency, Jean travelled to Rockhampton on many occasions to represent the Brisbane Branch. In 1997, she attended the last Assembly of the year at which she presented the Branch's gift to the School of a Wall Clock which bears the inscription *For life we are learning*. See picture above right: Jean with Shirley Crow (Rhodes).

In that same year, she also attended the RGGGS Speech Night and met with the recipient of the Brisbane Branch's *Nessie Foster Prize*. In 1998, Jean was a guest speaker at the Rockhampton OGA's Queensland Day Lunch where she spoke of the activities of the Brisbane Branch.
